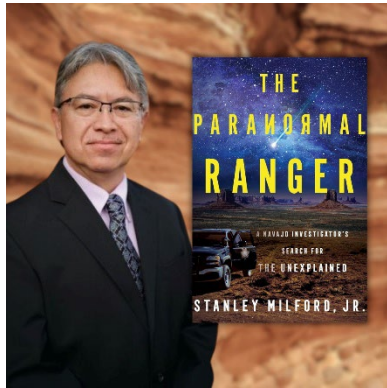


Online author talks explore Native American culture, childhood migration

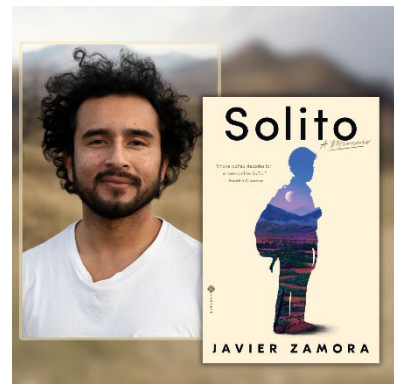
